




POST-TREATMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR TEETH WHITENING

- Avoid Staining Foods and Drinks: Refrain from consuming foods and beverages known to stain teeth, such as coffee, tea, red wine, and berries, for at least 24-48 hours after teeth whitening to maximize results.

- Use Sensitivity Toothpaste: If you experience tooth sensitivity after whitening, switch to a toothpaste formulated for sensitive teeth for a few days. This can help alleviate discomfort.
- Avoid Smoking and Tobacco Products: Refrain from smoking or using tobacco products for at least 24-48 hours after teeth whitening, as these can stain teeth and compromise the whitening results.
- Avoid Dark-Colored Mouthwash: Avoid mouthwash containing alcohol or dark-colored ingredients immediately after teeth whitening, as these can interfere with the whitening process.
- Stay Hydrated: Drink plenty of water after teeth whitening to keep your mouth hydrated and promote saliva production, which helps neutralize acids and maintain oral health
- Wait Before Eating or Drinking: Avoid eating or drinking anything except water for at least one hour after teeth whitening to allow the whitening gel to fully penetrate the teeth.
- Be Mindful of Sensitivity: It is normal to experience some tooth sensitivity after teeth whitening. If sensitivity persists or becomes severe, contact your dentist for advice on managing it.
- Follow-Up with Your Dentist: Attend any scheduled follow-up appointments with your dentist to evaluate the whitening results and address any concerns or questions you may have.
